Basic Data (excerpted from primary sources):

This mine is not listed as a new mine in 1910, and it may have been in operation prior to that time. The Hansen (aka Hanson) Coal Mine reported from 1910 through 1919. Although no information was noted to suggest that the Hansen (aka Hanson) mine was closed or not operating in or following 1919, no further listings were noted for a Hansen (or Hanson) Coal Mine. However, a Larson Coal Mine was noted in 1922, a Payne Coal Mine in 1923, a Larson & Payne Coal Mine in 1914, a Larson Coal Mine and a Payne Coal Mine in 1925, and a Larson Coal Mine (Payne superintendent) from 1926 through 1930. Information linking the Hansen (aka Hanson) Coal Mine with the Larson, Payne, and Larson & Payne coal mines was noted on a 1924 WCB map, which lists a Hanson Mine No. 2 with Lars Larson (owner) and G.F. Payne (operator) in T146N, R81W, Section 19, SW; it should be noted that no SEBR or CMID listings were noted for a Hanson Mine No. 2. Additionally, Leonard et al. (1925) indicate that a Hanson Mine was located in T146N, R81W, Section 18, SW, E1/2; no CMID listings were noted for a Hanson Mine following 1919. Only the Larson Coal Mine is reported from 1926 through 1930, and it is listed as closed in 1930; no listings were noted for any of the above mine names following 1930.

Notes:

The Hansen (aka Hanson) Coal Mine is listed as located in T146N, R81W, Section 18, W1/2, E1/2 in the 1912, 1914, 1916, and 1918 SEBRs. The Hansen Mine is listed as located in T146N, R81W, Section 18, SW, E1/2 in Leonard et al. (1925). The Hanson Mine No. 2 is listed as located in T146N, R81W, Section 18, SW on a 1924 WCB map.

No CMID listings were noted for a Hansen (aka Hanson) Coal Mine following 1919; however, references (i.e., 1924 WCB map and Leonard et al. 1925) refer to a Hanson Mine No. 2 and a Hansen Mine, at the locations provided in the above paragraph. The 1924 WCB map links Lars Larson and G.F. Payne with the Hanson Mine No. 2; Larson is listed as owner and Payne is listed as superintendent. The mines possibly represented by the Hansen (aka Hansen) Coal Mine, the Larson Coal Mine, the Payne Coal mine, and the Larson & Payne Coal Mine actually may be one mine, or they may represent a number of mines, all of which were located in some portion of the E1/2 of the W1/2 of Section 18. Information suggesting that the mine names may represent more than one mine located within the E1/2 of the W1/2 of Section 18 was noted in the 1925 CMID, which indicates that the Larson Coal Mine was closed and lists production figures for the Pavne Coal Mine--both mines are listed as drift (underground) mines. Additionally, the 1924 WCB map reference to a Hanson Mine No. 2 suggests that the Larson, Payne, and/or Larson & Payne mines may have been operated on land at least originally owned by Hansen (aka Hanson), but not necessarily at the same location as the Hansen Coal Mine reported from 1910 through 1919.

The Fjelddal (aka Fjeddal, Fjelddahl) Coal Mine/Wager (aka Wegener) Coal Mine also is located at this Planning Unit and AML location, and a Bitumina Coal Mine also may be located at this Planning Unit and AML location.
