Wilder (1902) indicates that the Fort Stevenson Mine was located in T148N, R85W, Section 35; Wilder (1902) also indicates that the mine was abandoned in 1902, but that it had been in operation for several years. Andrews (1939) indicates that "Probably the first mine opened by white men was the mine on the Garrison Creek [coal] bed in the SW1/4 sec. 35, T. 148 N., R. 85 W., that was worked by the men stationed at old Fort Stephenson." No production figures or additional data were noted about the Fort Stevenson mine, and no other mine names were noted in association with the legal location identified by this Planning Unit and AML location.
