Basic Data (excerpted from primary sources):

This mine was opened in the fall of 1913. The 1914 SEBR indicates that the main entry of the mine extended 50 ft. Coal was obtained by pick mining, and no rooms had been turned by December 1913; the coal was delivered at the mouth of the entry of the mine, and it had to be loaded into wagons by hand. The 1916 SEBR indicates that the main entry had extended to 75 ft. The mine was operated ". . .until the spring of 1914, when it was abandoned. Underground mining was done until the mine was abandoned, when a new strip mine was opened about a half mile north, known as the Roseno mine" (see Notes, below).
