

The Anderson mine lies about four and one-half miles south of Stanley, on the west side of the valley. In September a seam measuring six feet had been uncovered, with indications of a greater thickness. The point is well chosen for a mine, inasmuch as it lies at the edge of a draw nearly on a level with the road,- about thirty feet above the river. The approach is easy, and water will occasion little if any trouble. Mr. Alger's mine lies in a similar position in another draw. The following is the analysis of a dried sample from the Anderson mine :
