Basic Data (excerpted from primary sources):

This mine was opened in 1917. The mine was operated successfully from 1917 through 1928, when the Lucky Strike Coal Co. was reorganized into the Lucky Strike Coal Corp. At least by 1926, the mine was operated by use of electric undercutting equipment. The Lucky Strike Coal Corp. apparently was mismanaged, and the mine is listed closed in 1930. The Zap Colliery Co. leased the mine from about 1931 apparently through 1937, when the mine is listed as not operating; it appears that the mine was not operated following 1937. A portion of the Zap Colliery Co. mine is located at Planning Unit 061, AML location 616 (T144N, R88W, Section 31); however, related mine buildings and a mine camp were located in T144N, R89W, Section 24, which is directly east of the location of the Lucky Strike Coal mine, and miners that lived at the Zap Colliery Co. mine camp worked at the Lucky Strike Coal mine during those years it was leased.
