This mine is not listed as a new mine in 1909, and a reference was noted about this mine in the 1898 CAL; how any years prior to 1898 this mine may have been in operation is not known. The 1910 SEBR indicates that the mine "consists chiefly of a big outcrop of coal on the banks of the Heart River. . .Mr. Riley allows those choosing to mine coal the privilege of mining it here on the payment of a thirty-five cent per ton royalty. . .several rooms have been driven into the face of the outcrop, no regular system of mining having been adopted. The deepest of these rooms is about two hundred and fifty feet [250 ft.]." The 1912 SEBR indicates that the Riley Coal Mine was "operating during 1908 and 1909 and was closed during 1910 and 1911," and it appears likely that the mine ceased to operate following about 1909.
