

The Anderson bank, on the same creek, in Township 139, Range 99, Section 19, north one-half, shows twelve feet of lignite, the lower six or eight feet good, the upper part Of the seam being soft. As now exposed, from eight to ten feet of stripping is requiEed to secure the lignite. The position with reference to water level of the stream is the same as that at the Englehartson bank, and the distance between them being only two Miles, the two exposures probably represent the same seam. At the Anderson bank two thin streaks of clay occur in the lignite.
