Basic Data (excerpted from primary sources):

Wilder (1902) indicates that an outcrop was being mined for a mile or more along the gulch in T152N, R82W, Sections 15, 11, and 2. The mined area consisted of four large entries; however, no more specific location was provided for the mine in general or the entries specifically. No listings were noted for a Turtle Gulch Mine, and no other data was found in reference to this mine.

Wilder (1902) indicates that this mine was situated in T152N, R82W, Sections 15, 11, and 2; however, no part section is provided for the mine's location in any of these sections. Therefore, it is not known if this mine was situated at Planning Unit 103, AML location 325 (T152N, R82W Section 11, NW, E1/2), or if it was situated in some other portion of Section 11. Additionally it is not known if the mine was situated at Planning Unit 103, AML location 330 (T152N, R82W, Section 15, NE, SW) or Planning Unit 103, AML location 329 (T152N, R82W, Section 15, SE, SE), or if it was situated in some other portion of Section 15.
