

Fourteen miles northwest of the Kuntz Mine a lignite bed is mined riot far from the headwaters of Timber Creek, near the NW. corner of T. 132 N., R. 93 W. The full thickness is not exposed, but there is at least 5 feet of coal. A 6-foot bed of coal outcrops on the Cannon Ball River five miles east of the Hettinger County line, and it is not unlikely that this seam continues west into the latter county. Some ten or twelve miles west of the line a coal bed appears on the Cannon Ball in townships 133 and 134 of range 92. It has a thickness of 3 feet and is good lignite.
