Basic Data (excerpted from primary sources):

This mine is not listed as a new mine in 1909, and it may have been in operation prior to that time. The 1910 SEBR indicates that "Much of the output of this mine is sold on contract before it is mined, and insures steady work for the miners employed at all times during the year." This mine was operated and reported in 1910 and 1911, by which time the main entry extended 150 ft.; however, the 1912 SEBR indicates "On March 5th, 1912, when I inspected this property, I found the miners robbing pillars and entries and preparing to abandon the mine. This mine is located on a three foot vein of coal. . .and never at any time was a very satisfactory mine." The 1912 SEBR indicates that the Jewell Coal Mine was "closed in 1912-1913." No further listings were noted for the mine, and it is assumed that the mine ceased operations in early 1912.
